# Environmental Sustainability

Concern for environmental sustainability is part of the way First Horizon, First Tennessee and FTN Financial do business. We work to be "green," and we encourage our employees to do the same at work and at home. We continue to look for ways to enhance our processes and practices to decrease our impact on the environment.

Examples of current "green" or sustainable practices include:

- Buildings are designed with an awareness of energy consumption and the goal of enhancing our energy efficiency and sustainability, from window blinds to the heating and cooling systems to motion-sensored lighting to low water volume flush valves and faucets.
- Recycled products are considered for use in carpeting, wallpaper, fabrics, parking abutments, etc.
- We replaced and converted air conditioning equipment to use environmentally friendly refrigerant and renovated the mechanical equipment at our corporate headquarters to improve air quality and energy efficiency.
- Our recycling program with Cintas Document Management earned us the Document Management Award in 2010 for saving 5,156 trees, 114,689 gallons of oil and 2,154,800 gallons of water. On average, we recycle 10 tons of paper a month in addition to our shredding program.
- Solar panels recently installed at one of our operations centers produce 3400KWH of electricity per month.
- Indigenous planting is used for landscaping at all new facilities to reduce water consumption.
- The Green Group is comprised of employees from various locations and backgrounds who have a passion for the environment and green initiatives. The group discusses new ideas, analyzes costs, makes recommendations to management and implements approved ideas. The group has a dedicated page on the company's Intranet site to share creative ways to "be green" in the workplace and encourage employees to sign a pledge to practice environmentally friendly behaviors.
